

While I always appreciate sincere compliments, the subsequent question implied that somehow we had discovered a new pro-



The Dr. Brant Lee Doty Memorial Divine Servant Award is the highest award given by Great Lakes Christian College. It is named in honor of a beloved professor and administrator of our College who embodied the servant-leader model for almost 50 years. This recognition is given to a senior student or alumnus whose life has consistently illustrated the sacrificial spirit as taught by Jesus Christ and demonstrated in the life and service of Dr. Brant Lee Doty.

George Stehle came to Great Lakes Christian College following a sensing of God's call to ministry while still in High School. He entered college in 1953, the same year Dr. Doty began as a professor. The day he enrolled for classes, George Getchel, a senior student, asked him if he would be interested in a weekend preaching ministry – he said, "Yes," and thus began his life-long service to the Lord. Since that time, George has been a minister at churches in Michigan, Indiana, and Pennsylvania. In addition to those ministries, he served for 18 years as a professor of New Testament, Greek, and Practical Ministries at GLCC.

After retiring in 2002, he was approached by Great Lakes Christian Home in Holt to become their chaplain in residence. He has served effectively in that ministry since the fall of 2003.

He married Kathryn Moore in 1962 and God blessed them with 3 children and subsequently, 5 grandchildren. He has stated that his wife was the one responsible for any success he has enjoyed.

George Stehle is a wonderful example of a man who decided early in adulthood to give his life in service to the Lord. He has done that well as a preacher, professor, husband, and father. We are proud to have him be the recipient of the Dr. Brant Lee Doty Divine Servant Award.



Ron and Cindy Klepal: Ron Klepal faithfully served GLCC for 27 years and will be dearly missed.


