

George will continue to adjunct teach for us and continue his impact on students. If you would like to send greetings



### **Chuck and Amy Emmert Receive the 2020 Divine Servant Award**


Chuck and Amy Emmert received the Dr. Doty Divine Servant Award on August 29 as a part of the Commencement service for the 2020 graduates.

CONVOCATION kicks off the new college year with social distancing and masks up!


God has blessed with a great number of students to train and equip for His service. Classes began on August 24.
