

Great Lakes Christian College has an opening for a full-time professor of Interpersonal & Organizational Communication. The IOC program offers a broad survey of the field designed to prepare students for effective organizational communication roles as well as graduate work in a focused communication field.

Oualifications

- Preference will be given to candidates who hold a terminal degree in Communication or a closely related field. Consideration will also be given to persons with a master's degree who are willing to work toward or are in the process of earning a terminal degree in the field.
- Candidates must demonstrate eagerness to build GLCC's communications program; commitment to the values, churches, and institutions affiliated with the Christian Churches/Churches of Christ; and passion to follow Christ and seek God's kingdom first in all things.
- Candidates must possess the desire and ability to teach effectively, mentor young adults, work well with a team, and improve as a teacher and course developer.

Responsibilities

- Role specific responsibilities include teaching, mentoring, advising, tending to committee assignments, engaging in campus life, participating in faculty meetings, and using one's gifts and passions to serve the wider curriculum, college, and community.
- Faculty members are expected to spend at least 30 hours per week on campus, represent the college well before the wider public, engage GLCC's various constituencies constructively, and work alongside all other faculty and staff to recruit and retain students.
- All faculty are expected to abide by GLCC's Employee Handbook (note especially the GLCC Doctrinal Statement) and Faculty Handbook (note especially the Philosophy of Education and Curriculum and Faculty Vision Statement), both of which are available at www.glcc.edu/college-handbooks.

- Cover letter, curriculum vitae, and a philosophy of education
- Statement of faith which describes your journey of faith, including how your Christian commitment models the mission and values of GLCC, as well as your church affiliation and involvement
- If applicable, please submit any evidence of successful past teaching experience such as course evaluations or student work.
