Beginning this Fall, GLCC students will have two ways to prepare for a career in nursing or other allied health professions like physical and occupational therapy, nutrition, kinesiology, dental hygiene, and radiology.

This program includes an Associate of Arts: Science Track that will provide a well-rounded base education which meets 90% or more of the prerequisites of most colleges who offer degrees in the allied health professions.

It also includes a Bachelor of Science degree in Compassionate Care. That option provides a well-rounded interdisciplinary program that meets 90% or more of the prerequisites of most college's allied health programs while delivering a rich blend of Bible, science, humanities, psychology, ethics, and communication.

After completing either the associate or bachelor programs, students will have earned the prerequisites to enter a nursing program at schools like Lansing Community College, Michigan State University, or a variety of other schools to obtain their RN or Bachelor of Science in nursing in 18 months.
